COURSE DESCRIPTION

Seattle Reproductive Medicine and Northwest Hospital & Medical Center join together to present an overview of current issues in reproductive endocrinology, infertility and advanced reproductive technologies. This meeting is an opportunity for physicians to share information regarding clinic protocols, research findings and new developments.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Overview of the latest developments in assisted reproductive technology (ART) treatment
- Utilize current evidence to educate and prepare patients regarding concept of Elective Single Embryo Transfer
- Identify options available to female cancer patients with regard to fertility preservation and counsel patient on the need for rapid referral and treatment prior to initiation of chemotherapy and/ or radiation
- Review the pathophysiology of obesity and implications on fertility and pregnancy and understand the challenges of fertility treatment in the setting of obesity
- Compare and discuss available genetic screening tests for couples wanting to conceive
- Discuss recommendations with regard to nutrition, exercise, acupuncture, herbs in the preconception window
- Review currently available measures of ovarian reserve
- Discuss counseling of the non-infertile woman requesting fertility assessment, including interpretation and limitations of ovarian reserve testing
- Selecting a particular imaging technique based on the patient's symptoms and clinical presentation
- List the advantages and disadvantages of Vasectomy Reversals versus Testicular Sperm Retrieval and IVF
- Give patients factors that may help guide decisions on retrieving sperm in non-obstructive azoospermic males
- Counsel patients on the need for psychosocial counseling when using third party reproduction
- Discuss the recommended tests and counseling for not only sperm donor but also the sperm recipient
- Employ the current management, diagnostic updates, and latest information regarding PCOS and infertility
- Discuss the role of Vitamin D in long term health, fertility and pregnancy
